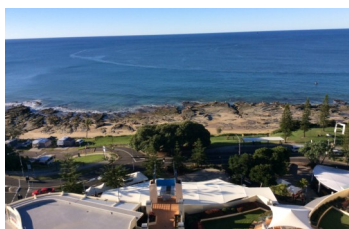

What we hope to present each month is a few hints on either how to present the rhythm, this month we included a few tips on cueing, as well as some suggestions for teaching the rhythm over a range of phase levels for the different groups. Note nearly all dances are from popular lists.

One of the presentations made at the conference was on the new Index of Rounds on the Roundalab web site. For those who have used Mark's Cue Sheets All Over site this is Cue Sheets All Over on steroids. What a wonderful job Mary Townsend-Manning has done to polish off a project started by Ken LaBau a few years ago. You search by all the things in Cue Sheets but then do all sorts of filtering and sorting. Anybody can also submit any of their dances, whether you are a member of Roundalab or not. However there are a few protocols. Let us know if you want to put something forward or you see something not correct and we will help. Just go to www.roundalab.org

The other big news from Roundalab is the suspension of the Rounds of the Quarter. This has been a necessary evil based on the legal technicalities of the way music is submitted for selection, and then sent out to the members of the phase committees. However, they still request you submit cue sheets in the hope we sort this out quickly.

2017 ... The RAL Convention and the National USA Square Dance Convention are again in the one place. This year at RAL we had the joy of presenting the Australian National Anthem on morning two with 150 Americans in voice singing along. Come along to Cincinnati at the end of June and also have your say in what happens with our activity on an international scale. For those choreographers, how about presenting your material to a few hundred dancers? The Showcase session at the US National is something to be seen to be experienced. Three days of dancing from morning to night across Phases II-VI. Why not then stick around for ICBDA from July 6th to 9th in San Diego? Over four days of dancing and education in Phase III-IV, or V-VI. This convention normally attracts over 500 dancers.

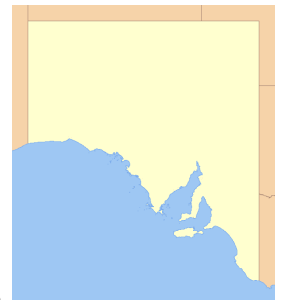
Then to finish off a great day, it was followed by a shared tea and you know how they can be? [Not good for the figure.]

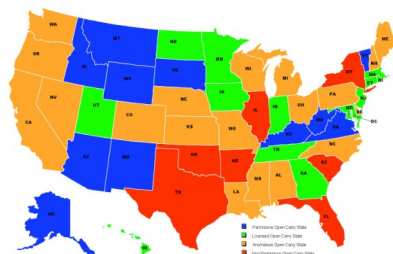

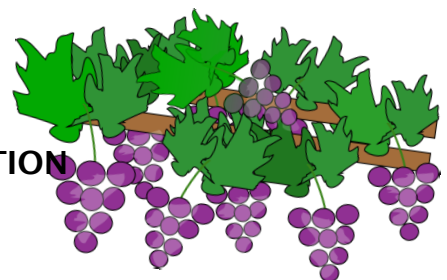
